Encompass Network is an umbrella organisation that supports, represents and links LGBT voluntary and community organisations working in equality and diversity across Cambridgeshire.

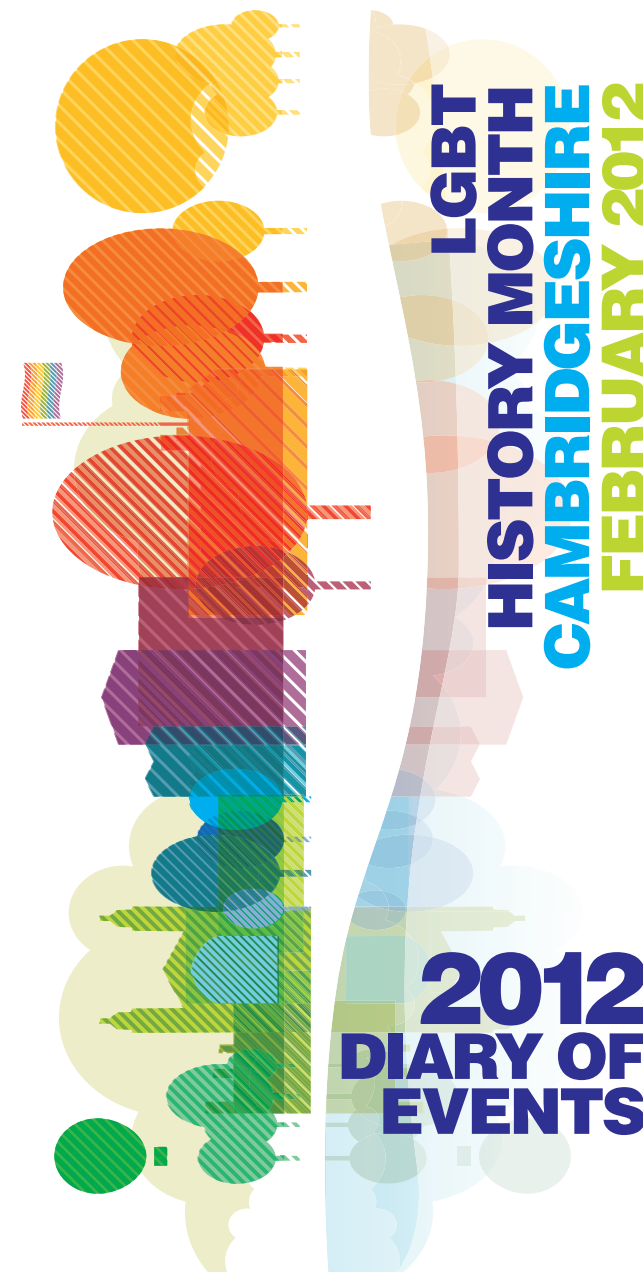
Encompass Network is working in partnership with many local organisations to organise events for this year’s LGBT History Month.
