

# PROCTORIAL NOTICE

## BICYCLES AND BOATS

Members of the University are reminded of Regulations 1 and 2 of the Regulations for Bicycles and Boats<sup>1</sup>.

In accordance with these Regulations, the Proctors give notice that bicycles and boats belonging to persons *in statu pupillari* must be marked with the letter pertaining to the owner's College (as below), followed by a personal number to be allotted by the College authorities. The letter and number must be clearly painted on the rear mudguard or frame of a bicycle, and on the bows of a boat. Thefts of bicycles in Cambridge are a cause for concern and it is important to get them marked clearly and promptly. This helps to prevent theft, and improves chances of recovery if theft does occur.

Under the Bye-Laws made by the Conservators of the River Cam, all pleasure boats of any kind kept or used on the River must be registered at the Central Office of the Conservators (The Guildhall, Cambridge), and each registered boat must carry a numbered label, which is supplied by the Central Office.
