

academical year 1999–2000 and the current year (so far) is running at a similar rate. E-business has featured steadily, as have smaller and US-based finance houses. Anecdotal evidence suggests that there is an increase in employers seeking postgraduate students (M.Phil.s and Ph.D.s) and M.B.A.s.
