THE TEACHING LABORATORY

It has been designed to be a flexible teaching and learning environment, catering for up to 24 students. It is equipped with 24 audio-active-comparative booths linked to a teacher's console, each booth is equipped with a video monitor which can receive live or recorded satellite programmes, or live CCTV images from the teacher. There is also an OHP available, plus a large 4' wide screen video/data projector connected to a multimedia PC and the Language Centre TV and data network for whole class teaching.
