# **Amending Statutes for Clare College: Notice**

18 February 2013

The Vice-Chancellor gives notice that he has received from the Governing Body of Clare College, in accordance with the provisions of Section 7(2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923, the text of a proposed Statute to amend the Statutes of the College. The proposal is to amend Statute 8(6) so as to read:

The Master shall vacate office on the last day of the academical year in which he or she has held office for ten years (or nine years if the effective date of election is in October); provided that a shorter term of office shall apply if, before the election, a majority of the electors present so resolve at a meeting held in accordance with Statute 9.

The current Statute 8(6) reads:

The Master shall not continue in office after the end of the academical year in which he or she attains the age of 70. If however one whom the College proposes to elect to the Mastership has on or before the date of the election attained the age of 63 but not the age of 66, they may be elected for a period terminating at any date after the end of the academical year in which they attain the age of 70 not later than the 30th of September following the expiry of seven years from the date of assuming office.

# Annual Reports of the Council and the General Board, 2011–12: Notice in response to Discussion remarks

The Council has considered the remarks made at the Discussion on 22 January 2013 (*Reporter*, 6295, 2012–13, p. 343) about its own Annual Report and the General Board's Annual Report to the Council for 2011–12. It has consulted the General Board on the remarks made about their Annual Report.

Professor G. R. Evans commented on the reporting of the outcome of the Review of the Unified Administrative Service (UAS). Several projects are underway that are expected to address the points raised in that review. The Annual Report mentions the review of IT and infrastructure, the proposals of which were put out to consultation in Michaelmas Term 2012; it is anticipated that a Report on the final recommendations will be published later this term. New developments in internal communications were discussed in November 2012 at the Communications Forum organized by the Office of External Affairs and Communications and will be taken forward over the next two terms. These and other initiatives will enable the administration to work more cohesively in supporting the University's operations.

The Council has nothing to add to its previous response to remarks made by Professor Evans on the Technical Review of the Statutes (*Reporter*, 6283, 2012–13, p. 85).

Professor Evans drew attention to the review of the University's governance arrangements, which is to take place by the end of the 2013–14 academical year and asked that a Notice be published about the review. The Council will consider the manner in which the review will be conducted next term and will publish a Notice about the arrangements for the review in Michaelmas Term 2013.

The Council and the General Board agree with Professor Evans that the Concordat to support Research Integrity is an important document that has provided a framework which this University and others will continue to develop and strengthen.

The Open Access working group established by the Research Policy Committee has a broad brief to consider in the round issues arising from the Open Access proposals including the resource issues to which Professor Evans draws attention and which are of serious concern.

Finally, Professor Evans commented that the Council Handbook could be published in a more usable format. It is already published on the Council's website as a PDF. It will in future also be published as a web page.

The Council is submitting a Grace for the approval of its Annual Report (which includes the General Board's Report) (Grace 1, p. 373).

# **Natural Sciences Tripos, Parts IB and III**

(Statutes and Ordinances, p. 402)

### With effect from September 2013

PART IB

Regulation 21.

The subject 'Ecology' moves from group (iv) to group (ii) and can no longer be taken with Pathology or Physics A, but can now be taken with Geological Sciences B or Physics B. An alternative field course will be introduced in September 2013.

PART III

Regulation 36.

History and Philosophy of Science

The number of short essay titles from which candidates can choose has been amended from four to eight.

The second sentence of the second paragraph has therefore been amended so as to read:

The list of short essay titles, from which candidates will choose two titles from eight, shall be issued by the Head of the Department of History and Philosophy of Science shortly after the division of Lent Term and students will have one week in which to prepare the two essays for submission to the Examiners.

# Report of the General Board on the establishment of an MRC Research Professorship of Epidemiology

The GENERAL BOARD beg leave to report to the University as follows:

- 1. In their Report on certain fixed-term Professorships and Readerships and future arrangements for awarding the title of Honorary Professor or Reader (Reporter, 5850, 2000-01, p. 814), the Board, in accordance with policy and procedure outlined in paragraph 6 of the Notice on appointments to unestablished posts at the level of Professor or Reader (*Reporter*, 5842, 2000–01, p. 552), proposed, inter alia, the establishment of a number of fixed-term Professorships and Readerships, in place of unestablished Research Professorships and Readerships. The Board, in their Notice, also stated their intention to recommend the establishment of Professorships on future occasions when an individual had been successful in a prestigious external competition, for example, Royal Society and MRC Research Professorships. In a further Report, dated 22 January 2003 (Reporter, 5911, 2002-03, p. 519), the Board proposed the establishment of Professorships for the holders of Wellcome Trust Principal Research Fellowships.
- 2. The Board have now considered a proposal for the establishment of an MRC Research Professorship of Epidemiology for Professor Nicholas Wareham, currently Director of the MRC Epidemiology Unit in Cambridge and Honorary Professor in the Faculty of Clinical Medicine. The Professorship is intended to be held in association with the Directorship of the Medical Research Council's Epidemiology Unit in Cambridge, which is in the process of being transferred to the University as an MRC University Unit. The award is not, however, contingent upon that transfer. The award from the MRC supporting the Professorship is for an initial period of ten years from the date of appointment, and is expected to be renewed for so long as Professor Wareham remains Director of the Unit. The Faculty Board of Clinical Medicine have agreed to meet the costs of the Professorship from the expiry of the MRC award, for the remainder of Professor Wareham's tenure should that be necessary.
- 3. The General Board recommend:
- I. That an MRC Research Professorship of Epidemiology be established from 1 May 2013 for the tenure of Professor Nicholas Wareham, placed in Schedule B of the Statutes, and assigned to the Faculty of Clinical Medicine.
