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REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS**Theological and Religious Studies Tripos**

(*Statutes and Ordinances*, p. 434)

With effect from 1 October 2017

The General Board, on the recommendation of the Faculty Board of Divinity, have approved a change to the title of the Tripos to 'Theology, Religion, and Philosophy of Religion' on the grounds that the revised title is consistent with the growth and change of the Faculty and of the discipline more widely; and also that it is compatible with the range of courses offered. The content of, and regulations for, the current Tripos will remain unchanged.

Both the Cambridge Admissions Office and the Faculty Board of Philosophy have been consulted over the proposals and have declared that they are content.

Graces submitted to the Regent House on 25 February 2015

The Council submits the following Graces to the Regent House. These Graces, unless they are withdrawn or a ballot is requested in accordance with the regulations for Graces of the Regent House (*Statutes and Ordinances*, p. 111), will be deemed to have been approved at 4 p.m. on Friday, 6 March 2015.

1. That the recommendations in paragraph 8 of the First-stage Report of the Council, dated 27 January 2015, on the construction of a new laboratory for the Schools of the Biological Sciences and Clinical Medicine (*Reporter*, 6373, 2014–15, p. 346) be approved.
2. That the recommendations in paragraph 7 of the Second-stage Report of the Council, dated 27 January 2015, on the project to expand the Addenbrooke's Clinical Research Centre at Addenbrooke's Hospital (*Reporter*, 6373, 2014–15, p. 348) be approved.
3. That the recommendations in paragraph 6 of the Report of the Council, dated 3 February 2015, on the reconfiguration and refurbishment of space within the Baker and Inglis buildings to establish a Dyson Centre for Engineering Design in the Department of Engineering (*Reporter*, 6374, 2014–15, p. 375) be approved.¹
4. That the recommendations in paragraph 8 of the Second-stage Report of the Council, dated 3 February 2015, on the development of the Greenwich House site (*Reporter*, 6374, 2014–15, p. 377) be approved.
5. That, with effect from 1 October 2015, the following amendments to the General Regulations for Admission as a Graduate Student (*Statutes and Ordinances*, p. 446) be approved:²

¹ The Council notes the remarks made by the Head and Deputy Head of the Department of Engineering in support of the recommendations of this Report (see p. 407) and now submits a Grace for the approval of those recommendations.

² The General Board, having consulted with the Degree Committees, propose the above amendments to address issues arising from diversification in the models for doctoral training that have been adopted. The amendments to Regulation 9 allow the Degree Committee to prescribe a second probationary review examination and those to Regulation 11(a) enable fees to be collected for four years of study with the prior approval of the Board. The opportunity is also being taken to update the list of degrees in Regulation 11(a).

By amending Regulations 9 and 10 so as to read:

9. The Degree Committee concerned shall have power to require a Graduate Student to take one or more progress examinations. The form of the examination shall be subject to approval by the Board. If the examination is for the purpose of registration for the Ph.D., Ed.D., M.Litt., M.Sc., or M.Phil. Degrees, it shall be held not later than the fourth term following admission of the student as a Graduate Student or at a time to be determined by the Board. For Graduate Students registered for the part-time Ph.D., Ed.D., M.Litt., or M.Sc. Degrees, the progress examination shall be not later than the sixth term after the term of the student's admission. The Board, after considering a recommendation by the Degree Committee, shall determine how many, if any, of the terms previous to an examination under this regulation shall be counted for the purpose of Regulation 1 of the regulations for the Ph.D., M.Sc., and M.Litt. Degrees, and Regulation 4 of the regulations for the M.Phil. Degree, and Regulation 4 of the regulations for the M.Res. Degree. In the case of a student who, following the completion of this registration examination, cannot be recommended for registration for the degree sought, the Degree Committee may agree the following:

- (i) to prescribe registration for a lower degree or certificate;
- and/or* (ii) to offer a further assessment for the purposes of reviewing the student's registration status at a time to be determined by the Board, provided that the further assessment is completed before the submission of a thesis for examination for any lower degree or certificate under (i).

It shall be the duty of the Examiners for the examination so approved to report in writing to the Degree Committee. The Degree Committee shall forward such reports to the Secretary of the Board.

The payment to any Examiner who is not a University officer (other than an Associate Lecturer who receives no stipend from the University) shall be fixed by the Board after considering a recommendation by the Degree Committee.

10. The Board shall have the power to remove any Graduate Student from the Register of Graduate Students:

- (a) if he or she is no longer a member of a College;
- (b) if he or she has failed to pay the fees due from a Graduate Student;
- (c) if he or she has completed twelve terms of research as a full-time Graduate Student registered for the Ph.D., M.Sc., M.Litt., or M.D. or Eng.D. Degree or a proportionately longer period if registered as a part-time Graduate Student. In such a case the Board shall consult the Degree Committee before depriving the person of the status of Graduate Student;
- (d) if, in the opinion of the Degree Committee and the Board, the report on an examination prescribed under Regulation 9 is such as to show that the candidate is not qualified to continue in her or his course;
- (e) if, after completing six terms (if registered for a full-time course) or ten terms (if registered for a part-time course) he or she is not registered as a candidate for any degree, provided that in such a case the Board shall have obtained the concurrence of the Degree Committee in the deprivation;
- (f) if the Degree Committee have satisfied the Board
 - (i) that the student has not been working to their satisfaction; *or*
 - (ii) that the student has not complied with the conditions laid down in her or his case; *or*
 - (iii) that, in their opinion, the student is not likely to reach the standard of the M.Sc. or M.Litt. Degree, or M.Phil. or M.Ed. or M.Res. Degree, or of any other qualification for which he or she might be registered as a candidate.

By amending Regulation 11(a) so as to read:

(a) A Graduate Student who is registered as a candidate for the Ph.D., Eng.D., M.Litt., or M.Sc. Degree shall pay the University Composition Fee as determined by Regulation 10 of the regulations for University Composition Fees for each term up to and including the term in which he or she submits a dissertation or a revised dissertation for the Ph.D., Eng.D., M.Litt., or M.Sc. Degree, up to a maximum of nine terms if a candidate for the Ph.D. or Eng.D. Degree (except in the case of certain doctoral programmes as defined by the Board, in which case up to twelve terms of fees may be collected), or six terms if a candidate for the M.Litt. or M.Sc. Degree. The maximum number of terms shall not include any term allowed to be counted under Regulation 5(d).

Professor D. CARDWELL (Department of Engineering and Fitzwilliam College):

Deputy Vice-Chancellor, I speak as Head of the Department of Engineering.

Engineering is a practical subject, and our students are engaged in a variety of practical projects outside the formal

taught curriculum. These projects not only develop their enthusiasm for the subject, but also lead to new developments that both advance the subject and give rise to new spin-out companies to take these ideas outside into the wider world. The proposed Dyson Centre, funded generously by the James Dyson Foundation and HEFCE, will allow us to give these projects a proper home at the centre of the Department.

There is a great deal of excitement in the Engineering Department at this development. I urge support for the Council's Report recommending the establishment of the Dyson Centre.

Dr S. D. GUEST (Department of Engineering and Trinity Hall), read by Professor Cardwell:

Deputy Vice-Chancellor, I speak as Deputy Head of the Department of Engineering with responsibility for undergraduate teaching.

I would like to echo Professor Cardwell's comments, and would also like to note that the proposed Dyson Centre will have a tremendously beneficial impact on project work that forms an integral and popular part of the Engineering Tripos. Furthermore, the associated refurbishment of the library, and the improved circulation allowed by the new bridge, will transform the spaces that are available to our students for both collaborative and private study. I urge support for the Council's Report recommending this scheme.
