Matters for discussion

3796 <u>Request to amend the Special Regulations: MPhil in Latin</u> <u>American Studies</u> (Paper 4490)

The Board agreed to an amendment to the Special Regulations for the MPhil degree in Latin American Studies with effect from 1 October 2011.

3797 <u>Request to amend the Special Regulations: MPhil in Modern</u> <u>European History</u> (Paper 4491)

The Board agreed to an amendment to the Special Regulations for the MPhil degree in Modern European History with effect from 1 October 2011.

3801 <u>English Language requirements for students sponsored under</u> <u>Tier 4 of the Points Based Immigration System</u> (Paper 4495)

The Board received the report and noted that visiting students sponsored under tier 4 would now have to meet the UKBA's minimum language requirement. It agreed that guidelines should be circulated to Departments.

3805 Application to admit part-time students

The Board approved the proposal from the Degree Committee for Clinical Medicine & Veterinary Medicine to admit part-time PhD students in the Department in Clinical Neurosciences and for the MPhil in Clinical Science (Clinical Neuroscience) with effect from 1 October 2011.

3806 Application for differential University Composition Fee (Paper 4500)

The Board approved the proposal from the Degree Committee for Clinical Medicine & Veterinary Medicine to introduce a differential University Composition Fee for the MPhil in Clinical Science for overseas students with effect from 1 October 2012. It noted that the fee would be set at £21 447 for 2012-13.

3807 Update on graduate admissions and Electronic Data Management (EDM)

The Board noted that there has been a 10% rise in applications, a 7% fall in conditional offers and a 17% fall in confirmations as compared to the same time last year and that 88% of the maximum allowable offers have been made by the Schools.

Dr Biggs reported that EDM was progressing to schedule and was in the final rounds of testing. The system was scheduled to go-live on 19 July.

3808 <u>Submission of documents to meet offer conditions</u> (Paper 4522)

The Board agreed that a certain percentage of applicants would be required to submit original documentation.
