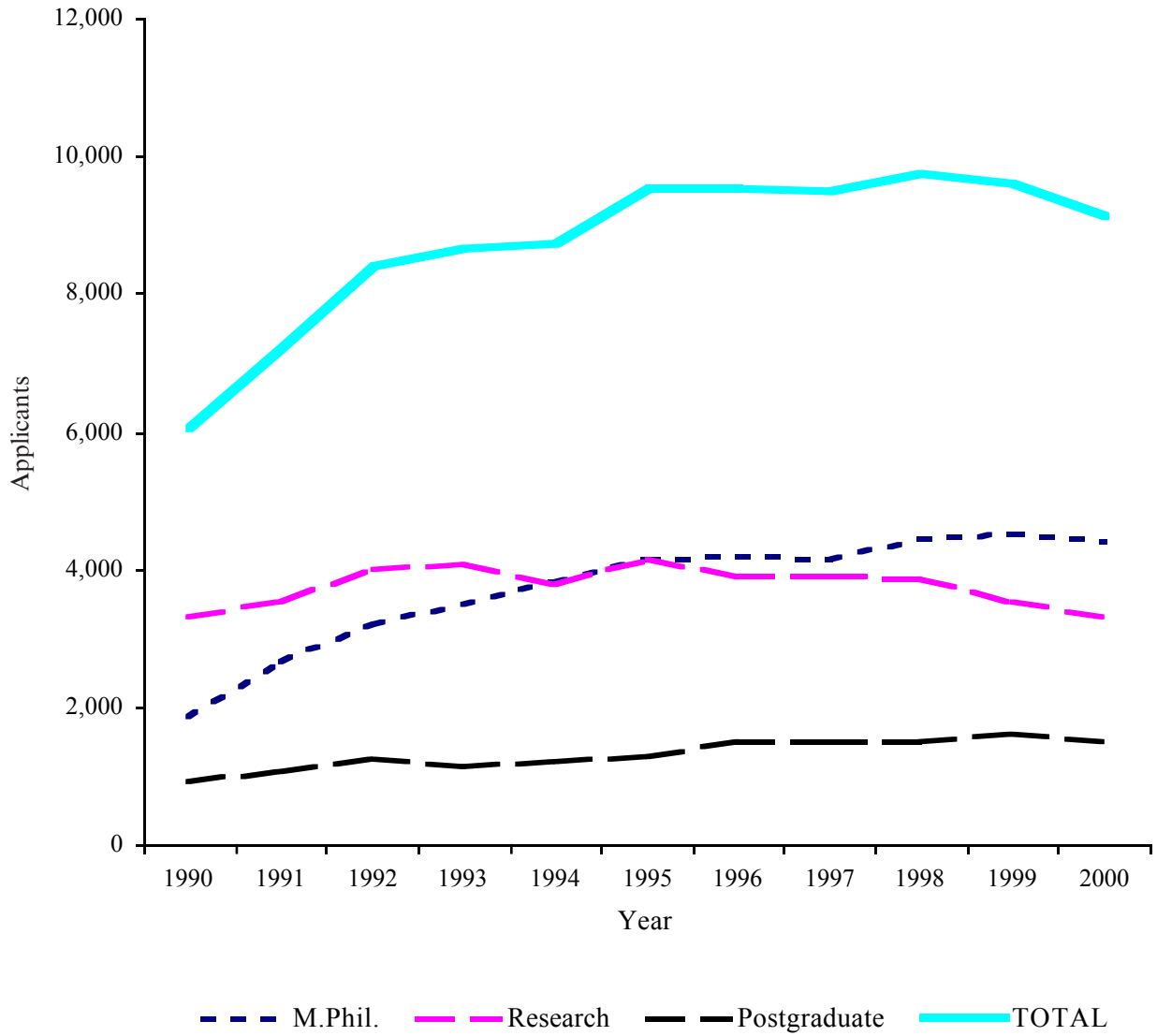

Applications by fee status for Graduate and Postgraduate Courses 1990–2000

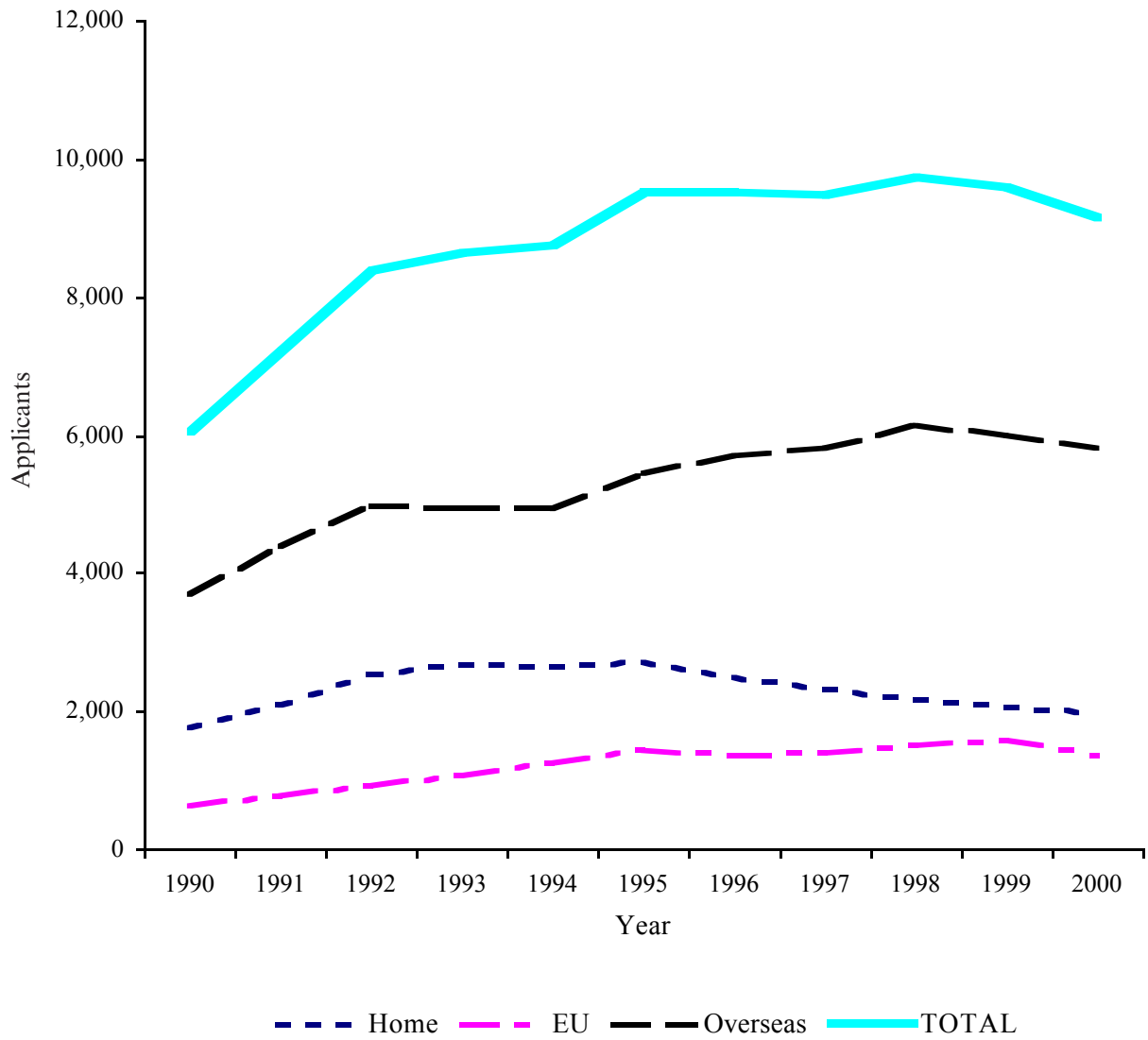

Graduate Students coming into residence by fees status 1990–2000

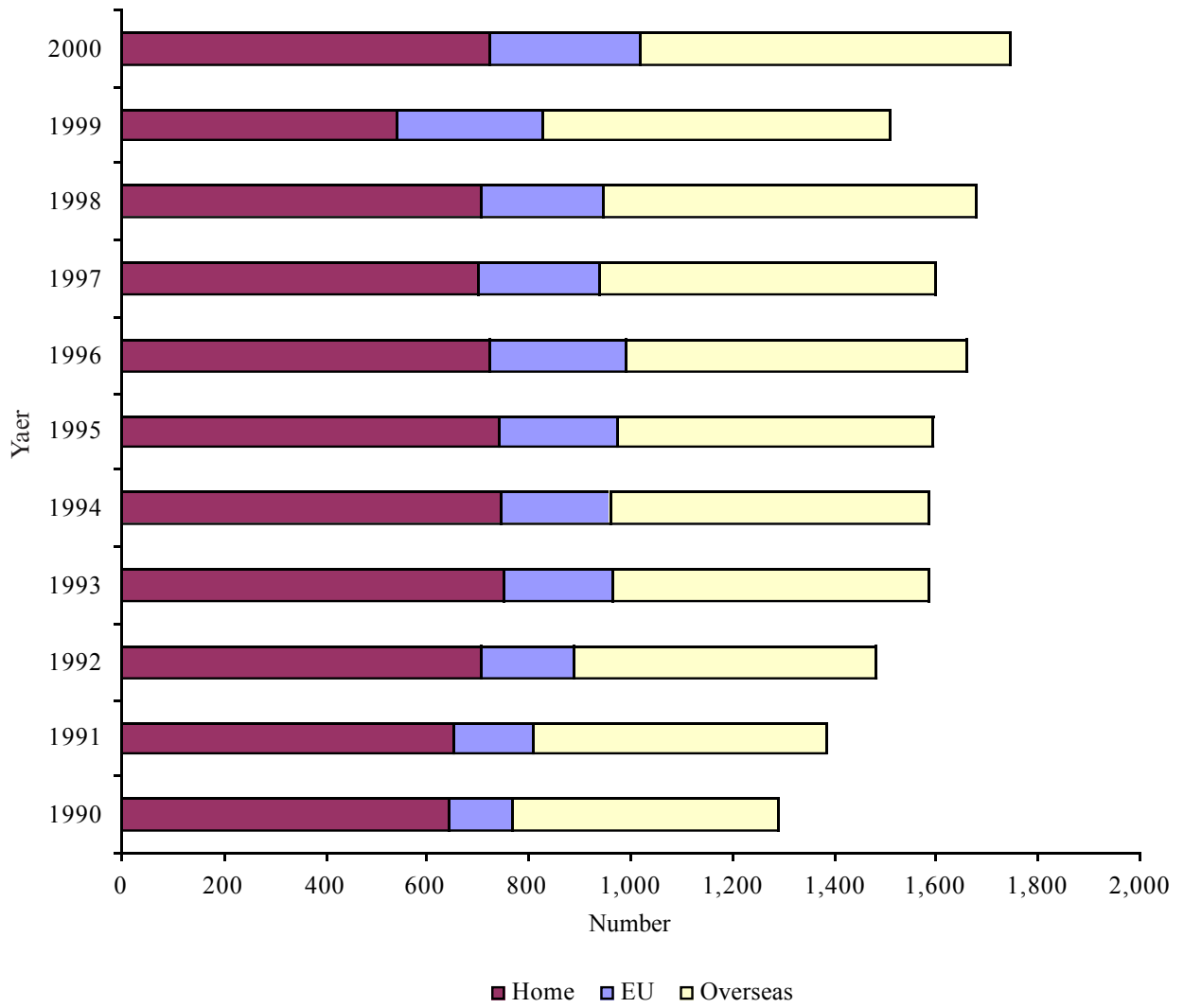

Numbers of Graduate Students in residence by fee status 1990–2000

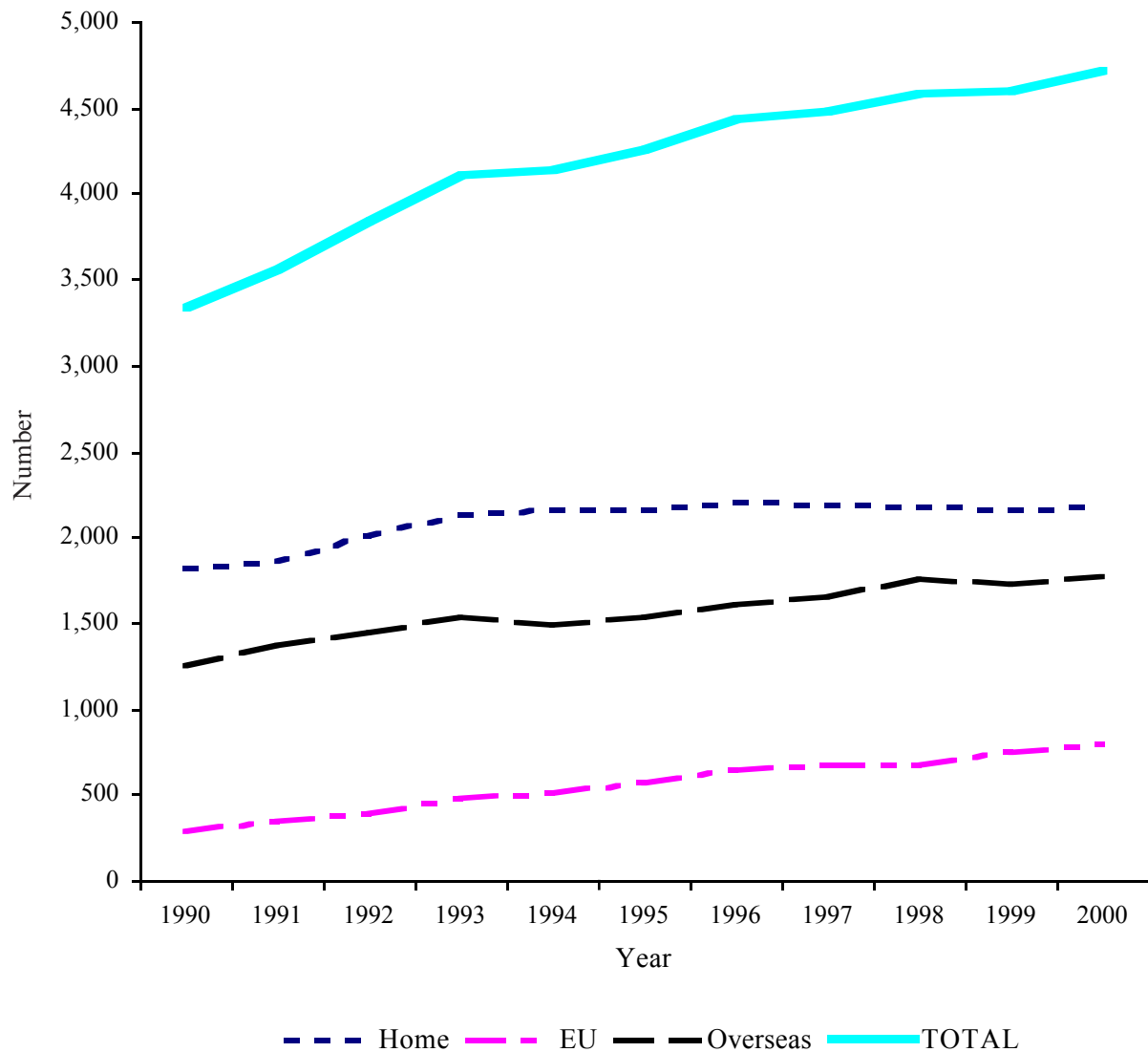

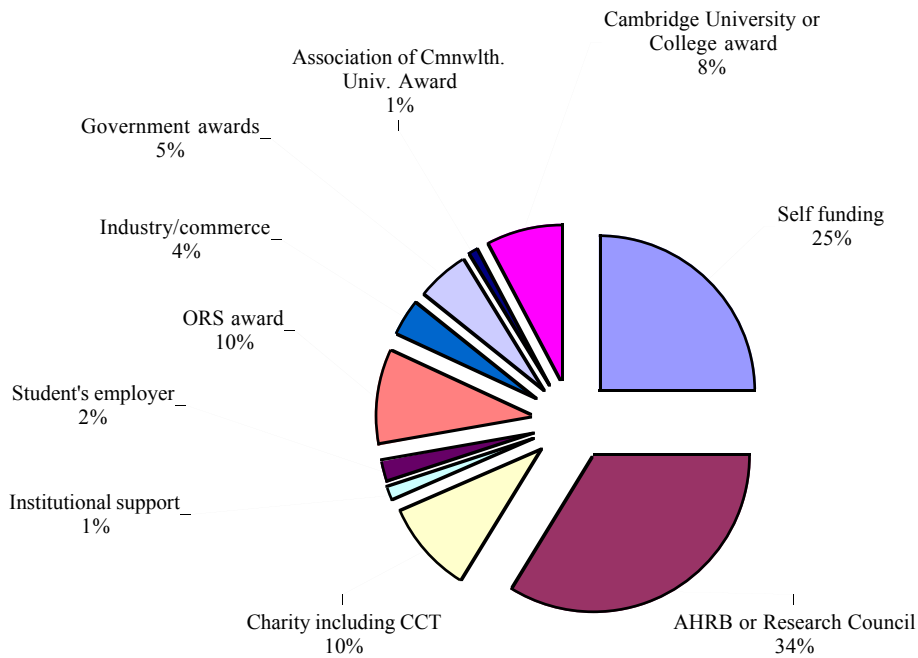

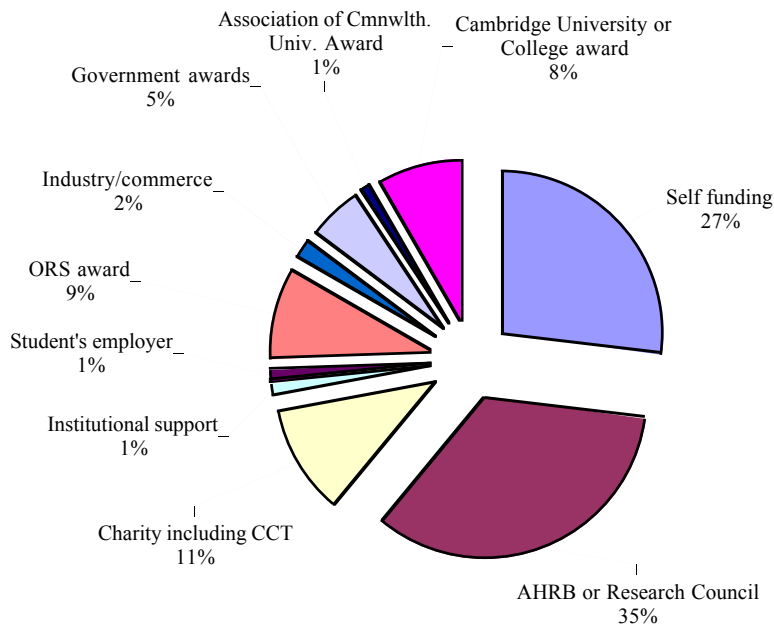

Charts showing funding sources of Graduate Students

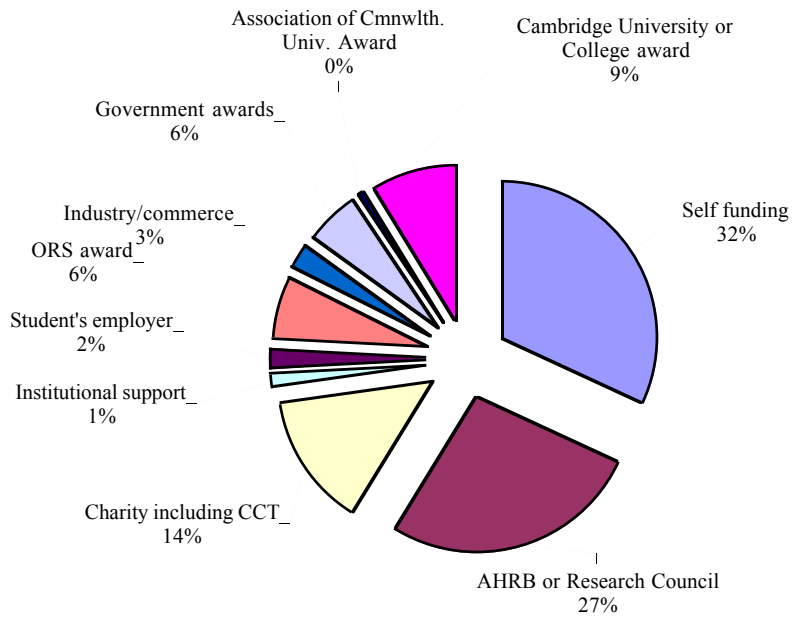
Fee source for all male Graduate Students in residence in 2000



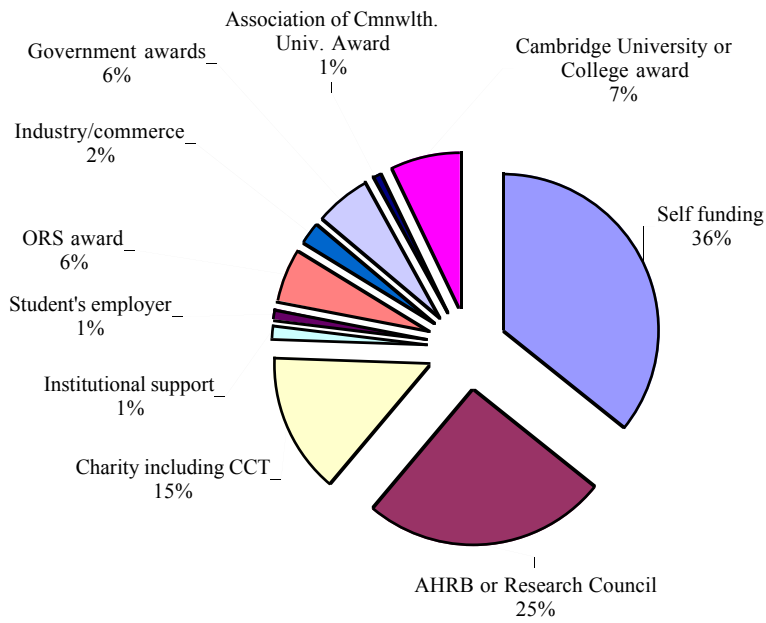
Fee source for all female Graduate Students in residence in 2000



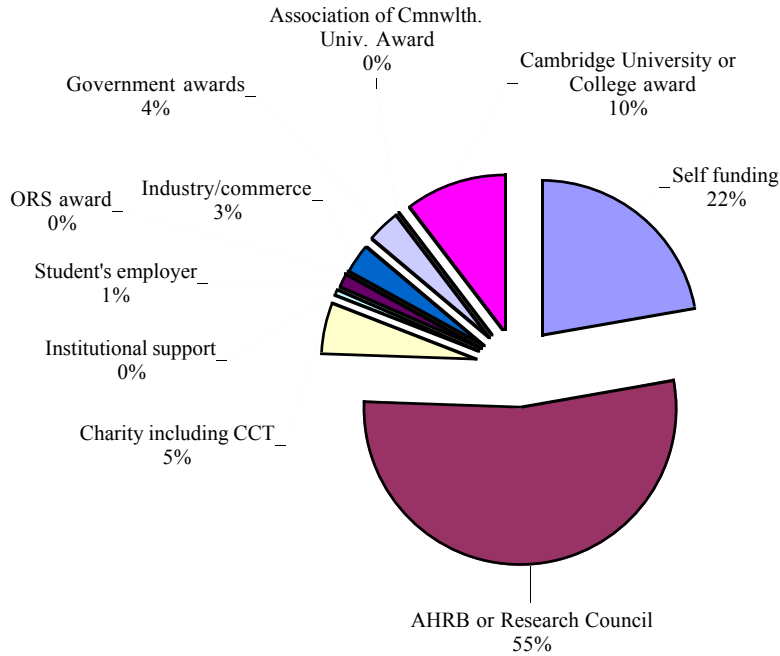
Fee source for male Graduate Students admitted in 2000



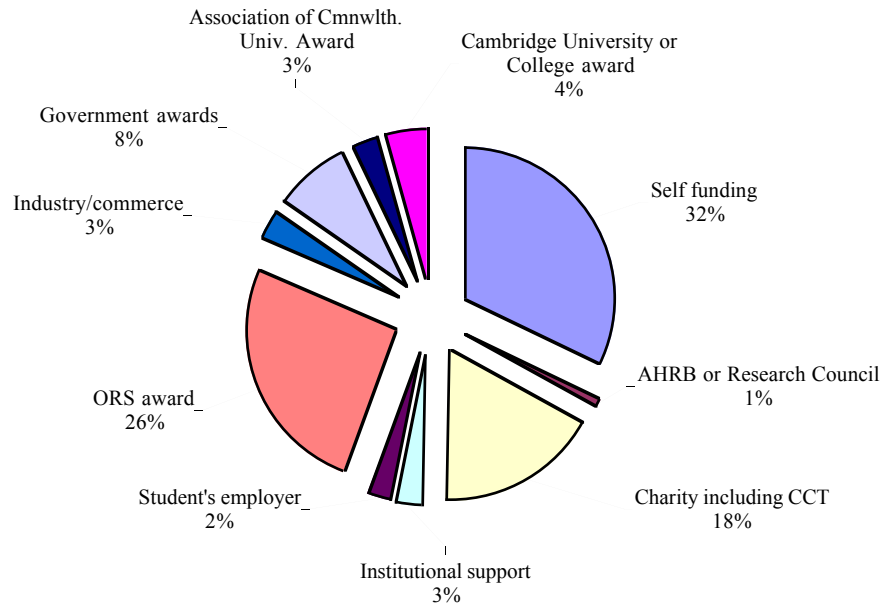
Fee source for female Graduate Students admitted in 2000



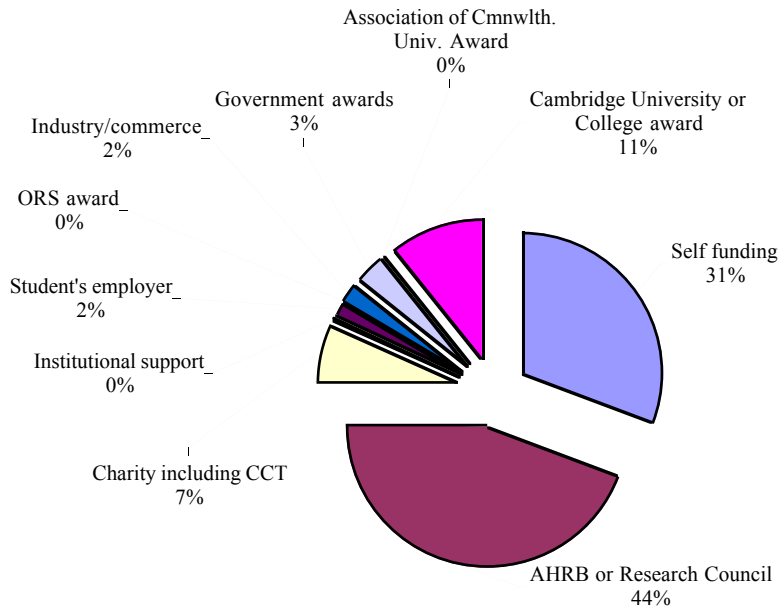
Fee source for all Graduate Students in residence in 2000 and paying Home Fees
