Fig. 1 Applications for Graduate and Postgraduate Courses 1991–2001

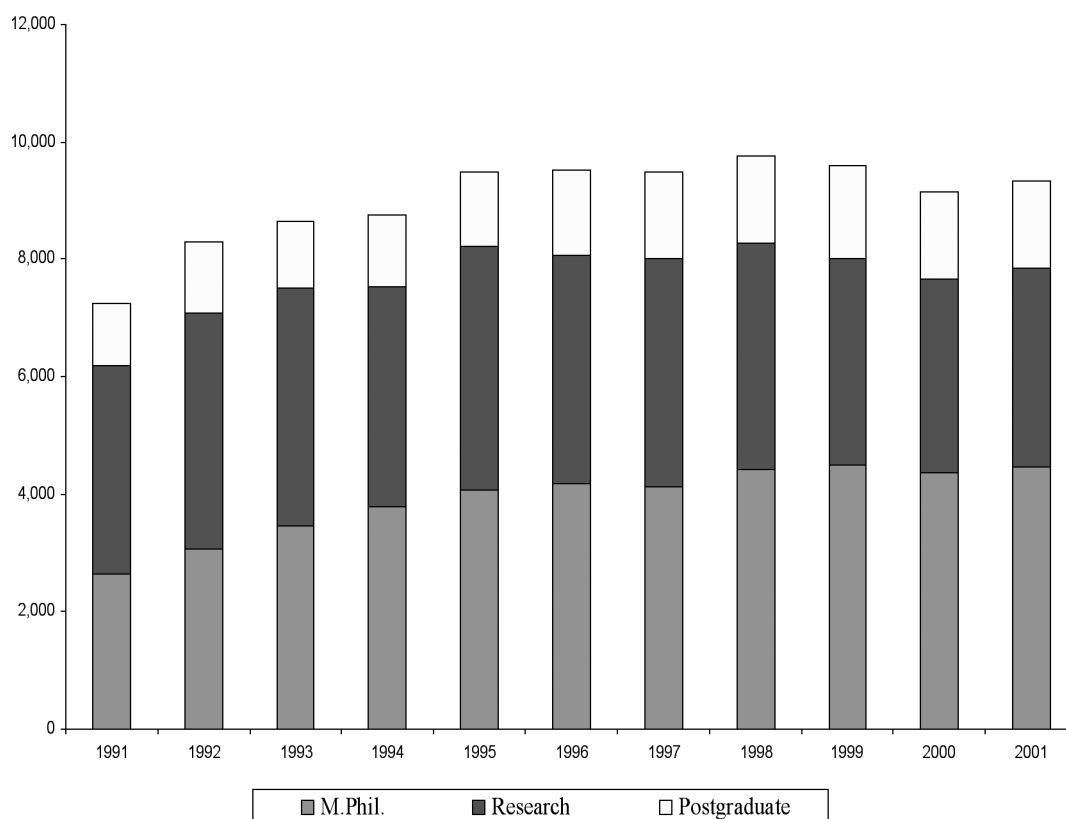
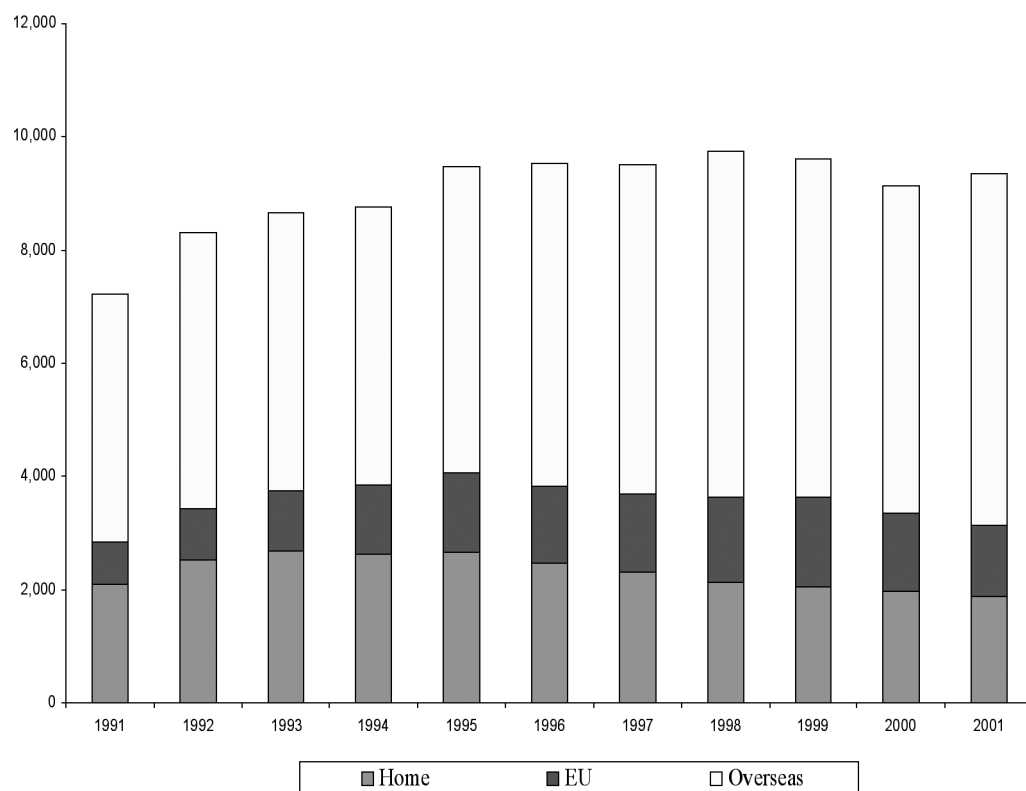


Fig. 2 Applications by fee status for Graduate and Postgraduate Courses 1991–2001**Table 2: Offers of admission as a Graduate Student and numbers coming into residence***(a) Offers of admission: one-year M.Phil. Degree courses*

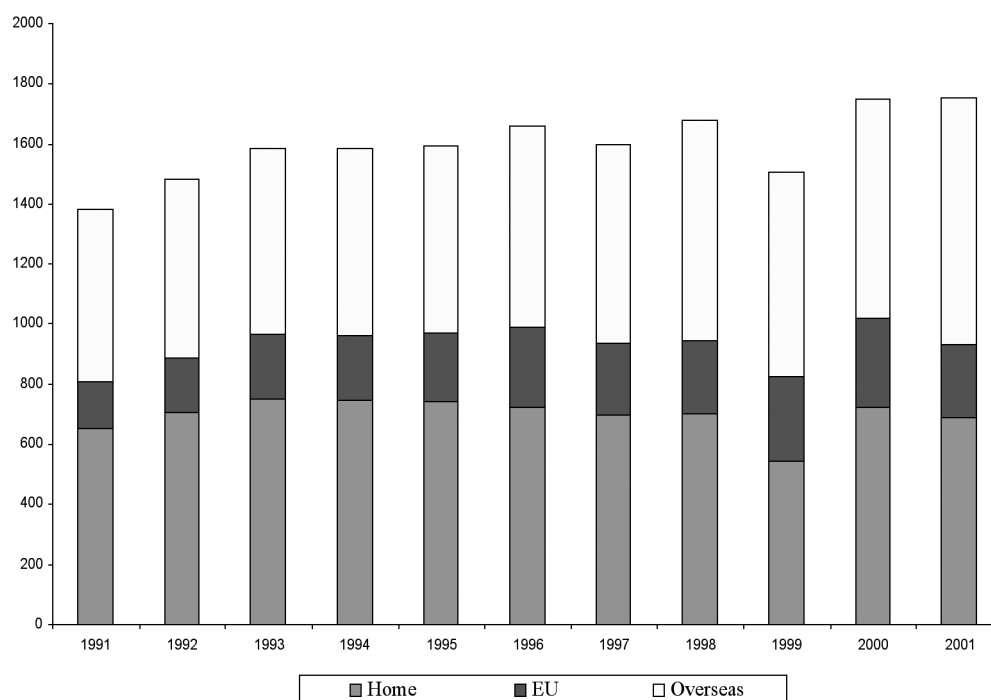

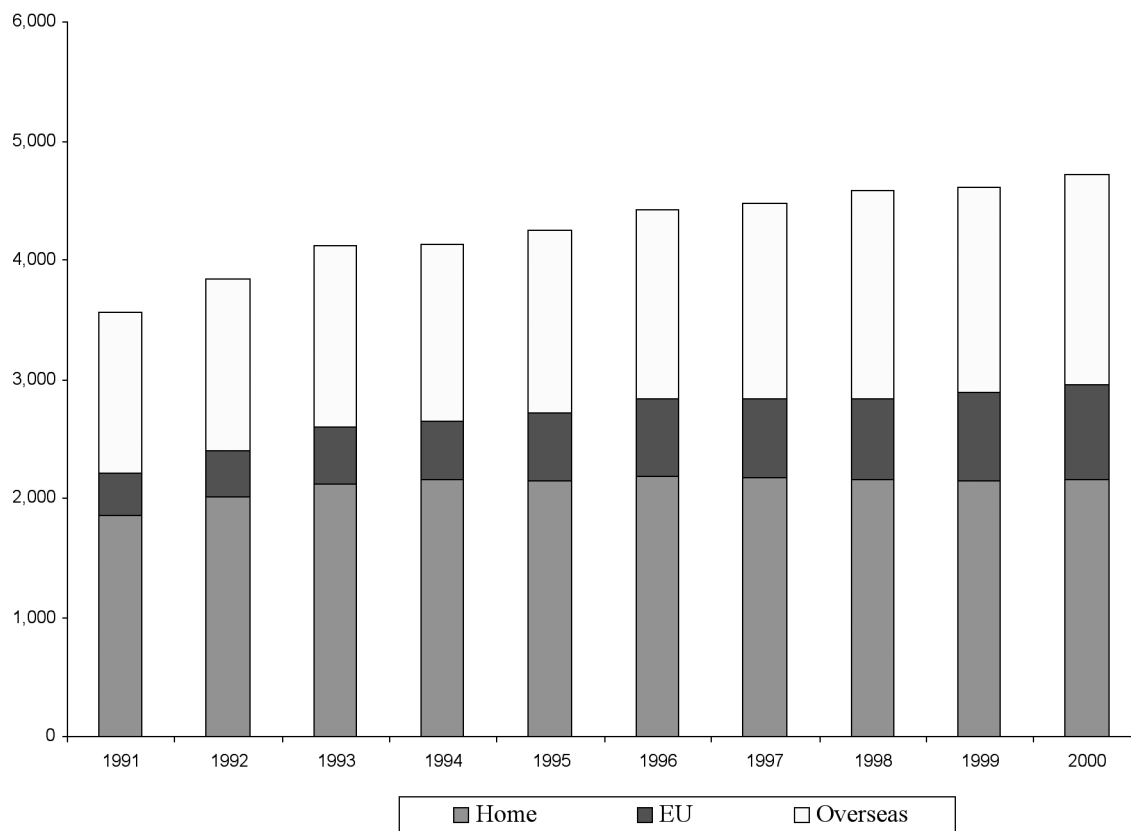
Fig. 3 Number of Graduate Students in residence by fee status 1991–2001
