Figure 1: Applications for Graduate and Postgraduate Courses 1993–2003

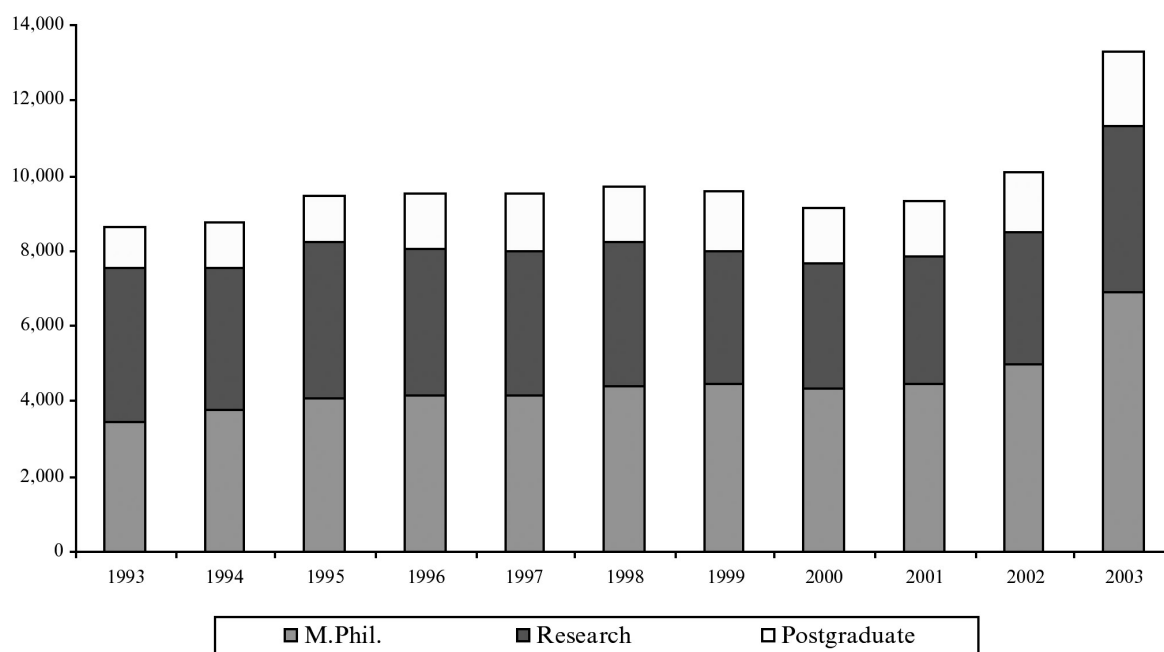
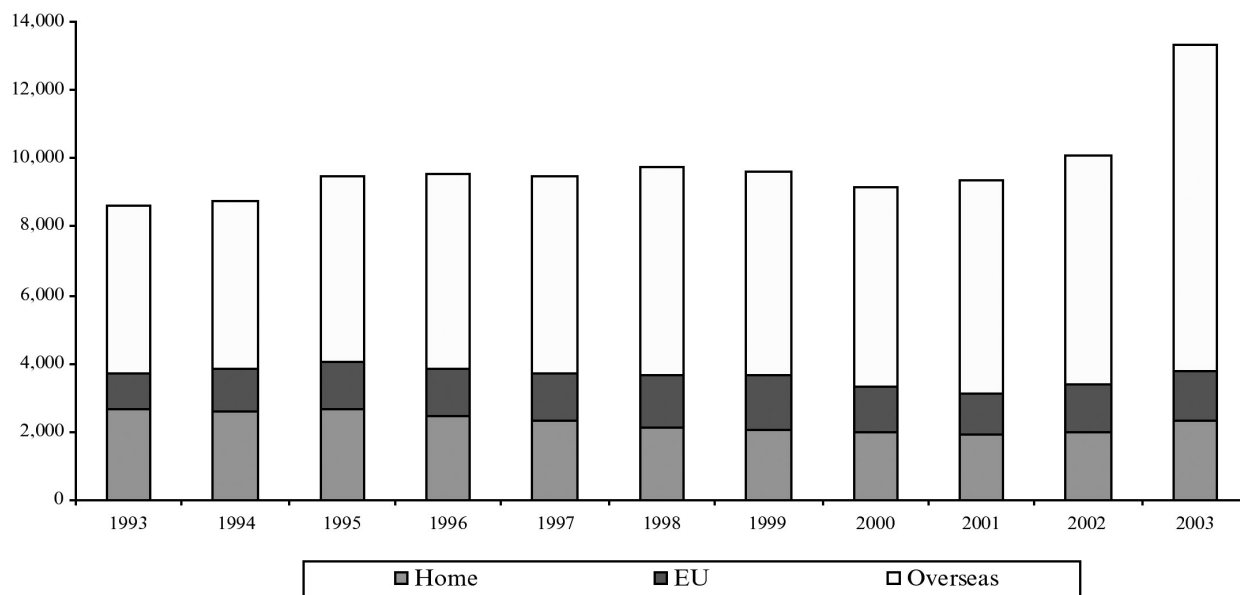


Figure 2: Applications by fee status for Graduate and Postgraduate Courses 1993–2003**Table 2: Offers of admission as a Graduate Student and numbers coming into residence***(a) Offers of admission: M.Phil. Degree courses*

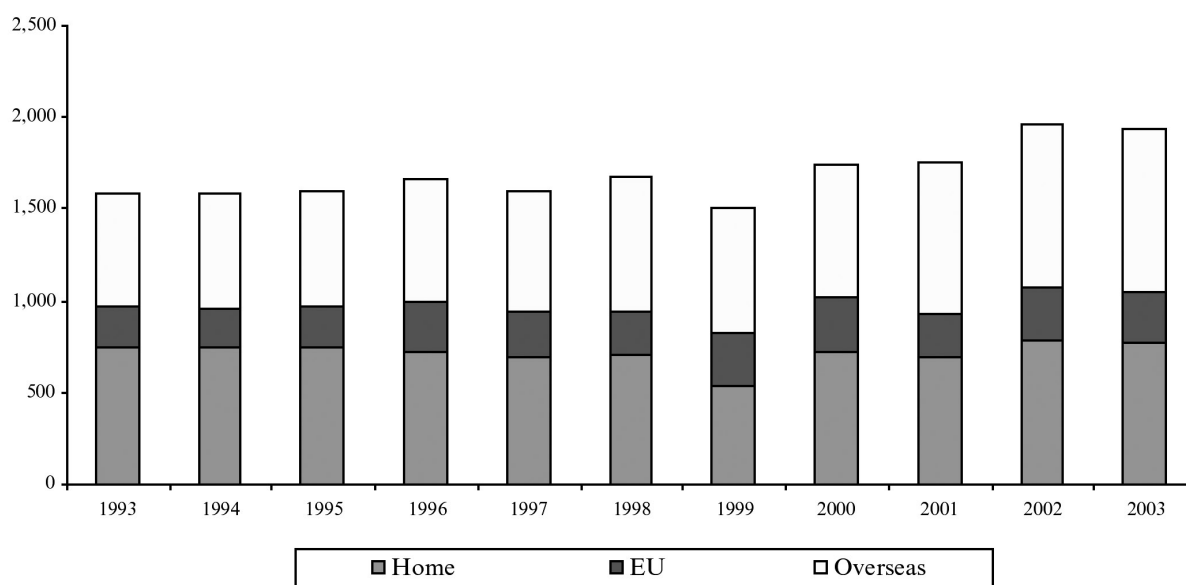

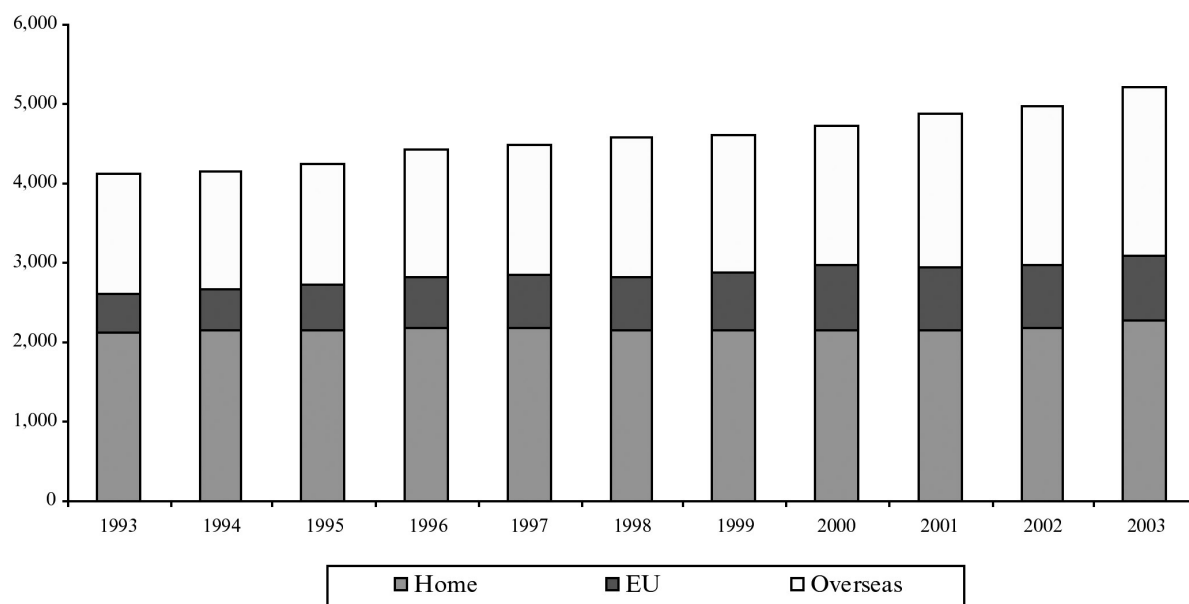
Figure 4: Number of Graduate Students in residence by fee status 1993–2003
