In Table 3.1 the three highest A level grades in all subjects, excluding General Studies, are used for scoring purposes.

In previous years the A level scoring system used has been the old system where A = 10, B = 8, C = 6, D = 4, E = 2. Data is provided this year using the new UCAS tariff scoring system where at A level A = 120, B = 100, C = 80, D = 60, E = 40 and where at AS level A = 60, B = 50, C = 40, D = 30, E = 20.
