Applications for the former Social & Political Sciences course have been counted as Politics, Psychology & Sociology, as accepted students applying under the old course code were admitted to the renamed course.

Mathematics includes those applying for Mathematics and Mathematics with Physics. Medical Sciences includes both those applying for Medicine and for the Cambridge Graduate Course in Medicine. The Tripos courses at Cambridge in Chemical Engineering, Management Studies and Manufacturing Engineering can be taken only after Part 1 in another subject. Applications and acceptances for these courses are recorded under the first year subjects taken by the applicants involved.

Linguistics could only be taken after Part 1 of another Tripos for 2009 entry. From 2010 entry onwards, however, this subject became available as a full three-year degree programme, and one male Modern & Medieval Languages (MML) applicant was in fact admitted for deferred entry to Linguistics (counted in MML acceptance figures above).
