Office of Vice-Chancellor: Advisory Committee for Nominations appointed

26 October 2021

On 20 September 2021 Professor Stephen Toope, *CLH*, notified the Council of his decision to complete his term as Vice-Chancellor on 30 September 2022, after five years in office. The Council has appointed a committee to advise it on the choice of a person to be nominated for appointment to the office of Vice-Chancellor from 1 October 2022, in accordance with Regulation 1 of the Special Regulations for the Vice-Chancellor (*Statutes and Ordinances*, p. 695). The Council wishes to appoint to the Committee one further external member who is, or was until recently, the Vice-Chancellor or equivalent of a university. The name of that member will be confirmed by Notice in or before early Lent Term 2022. The Committee expects to announce the opening of a consultation and dates of open meetings, to enable members of the University to provide their views and inform the search, later this term.

The Special Regulations require that the Advisory Committee consist of 'not less than eight persons, a majority of whom shall be resident members of the Regent House and at least two of whom shall be persons who are not resident members of the University.' For this search, the Council has agreed to the following composition and membership of the Committee. Scientific Computing for the M.Phil. Degree, 2021–22

REPORTS

Report of the General Board on the re-establishment of a Professorship

The GENERAL BOARD begs leave to report to the University as follows:

- 1. The General Board recommends the re-establishment of the Genzyme Professorship of Experimental Medicine as set out in paragraph 2 below. The funding arrangements for the Professorship were scrutinised by the Chair of the Resource Management Committee on behalf of the Committee on 14 October 2021, subject to confirmation of matters that were confirmed on 15 October 2021.
- 2. The Board has accepted an academic case from the Council of the School of Clinical Medicine for the re-establishment of a Genzyme Professorship of Experimental Medicine, for a single tenure from 7 January 2022, in the Department of Medicine. A Genzyme Professorship was originally established for a single tenure in 2006, following a donation from the Genzyme Corporation, to part-fund the appointee to develop a programme of novel immunological research (*Reporter*, 6032, 2005–06, p. 506). Funding for the

Professorship will be split, with approximately 50% coming from University non-Chest sources and 50% from Cambridge University Hospitals NHS Trust. The University non-Chest funding will initially be from the Genzyme Experimental Medicine Fund (Statutes and Ordinances, p. 729) until the funds are exhausted, and thereafter the Professorship will be supported by the income from the Sheila Joan Smith Professorship Fund (Statutes and Ordinances, p. 984), whereupon the title of the office will be revised to the Sheila Joan Smith Professorship of Experimental Medicine, to reflect the change in funding. The Board has agreed that election to the Professorship should be made by an ad hoc Board of Electors and preference should be given to those candidates with a focus on research and teaching in the field of immunology and infection, and with clinical expertise in the field of clinical immunology.

3. The General Board recommends that a Genzyme Professorship of Experimental Medicine be established in the University for a single tenure from 7 January 2022, placed in the Schedule to Special Ordinance C (vii) 1, and assigned to the Department of Medicine.
